Dear Dr. Geller:

I saw your patient, Mr. Sherman Lyon, in the Ophthalmology Department, on December 29, 2005. You, of course, are familiar with the history on this patient, so I will not repeat the details here.

Suffice it to say that Mr. Lyon has poor vision in the left eye, and has been very bothered by the vitreous detachment symptoms that he has had in the right eye. Several months ago he underwent laser treatment for elimination of his floaters at your office. I am pleased to report that he has had an almost total resolution of his floater symptoms in his dominant eye.

Physical examination reveals a visual acuity of 20/20 in the right eye, and 20/40 in the left eye. Fundus examination reveals mild vitreous syneresis with no obvious densities floating over the posterior pole. The peripheral retina is attached and there are no retinal tears identified.

Congratulations on a fine job for Mr. Lyon. He is very happy with his results.
